

### THE HEARTBEAT OF ASSAM


From Jorhat's heart, a melody rose,

## A Journey of learning and Service at Rashtriya Gramin Vikash Nidhi (RGVN)

As part of my BSW program, I completed a one-month fieldwork placement at Rashtriya Gramin Vikas Nidhi (RGVN), Guwahati—a national-level organization established in 1990 that promotes sustainable livelihoods and women's empowerment across 13 Indian states. The internship provided valuable exposure to the functioning of development organizations and their impact at the grassroots level.

During my placement, I participated in orientation sessions, survey design, casework, group facilitation with Self-Help Groups (SHGs), and field visits to Barchandra Village, Changsari, to assess RGVN's development initiatives. I also assisted in documentation and attended an expert session by the National Productivity Council on "Value Addition and Market Linkages for Sustainable Livelihoods."

The field experience helped me understand how community participation and women's involvement contribute to sustainable social change. I developed key skills in communication, empathy, teamwork, documentation, and data analysis, and gained insights into social work methods and rural livelihood practices.

This internship bridged the gap between academic learning and practical application, reinforcing my belief that true empowerment begins when communities take charge of their own development. I am deeply grateful to RGVN, my faculty mentor Ms. Bandana Thakur, and my peers for their constant support and encouragement. ## Achievements

Publication in Edited Volume Students from the School of Pharmacy, Kaziranga University, Md. Musadique Rahman, Mehnaj Simran Ahmed, and Bitumoni Roy (B.Pharm, 7<sup>th</sup> Semester) have co-authored a review chapter titled "Gold Nanoparticles: A Novel Frontier in Cancer Treatment" published in the book "Next Generation Research Innovations: Transforming Health Sciences" (ISBN: 978-81-974154-8-7) by Academic Decipher Press, Mumbai.

The work was completed under the mentorship of Mr. Bhargab Sarmah, Assistant Professor, School of Pharmacy, with Arpan Som as the corresponding author. The chapter highlights the promising role of gold nanoparticles (AuNPs) in enhancing targeted cancer therapy with improved efficacy and reduced side effects.

This publication marks the first scholarly contribution of the students and reflects the School's continued commitment to research excellence and innovation.
